Vintage and Winemaking Detail

Spring and summer temperatures in 2009 were very cool bringing us a long growing season. A late September heat spike caused most of the Central Coast grapes to ripen around the same time. We started to pick the Vineyards in late September, and finished in mid-October with exceptional quality. These three Pinot Noir Vineyards were picked within a few days of each other in early October, each possessing unique traits that created a wine with more personality. The juice remained on the skin for a few days to gain that perfect pink tint then bled off into a stainless steel tank where it was fermented. The wine remained in tank until it was bottled in early February preserving its fresh and zingy character of the 2009 vintage.
