The unique personality of Calera's Mt. Harlan Chardonnay vineyard is clearly expressed in the delicious 2000 Mt. Harlan Chardonnay. Wonderful aromas and flavors of pear and melon wrap around a core minerality, attributable to Mt. Harlan's limestone soils. Rich and silky on the palate with excellent balance and a lingering finish, this is an exceptionally memorable wine.

**THE MT. HARLAN APPELLATION** was established in 1990.

**2,200 FEET** above sea level, on average, they are among the highest and coolest vineyards in California. Yields in these arid, steeply sloped mountain vineyards are consistently low, rarely exceeding 2 tons/acre.

**THE 3 MILLION TON DEPOSIT OF LIMESTONE** within our mountain lends a very distinctive and fabulous minerality to all wines made from Mt. Harlan grapes.
